

Support us with our Cemetery Project in High Point



The Lt. F.C. Frazier Camp 668 and Laura Wesson Chapter 5 have had the goal for a few years to establish a project to address the final resting place of the 50 Confederate soldiers from Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, Louisiana, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia who died at the nearby Wayside Hospital and buried at Oakwood Cemetery in High Point during the War Between the States.

This goal originated as during our annual memorial service in observance of Confederate Memorial Day in front of the monument at these soldier's graves along with the marker of Heroine Laura Wesson. Miss Wesson died at young age of 20 after getting sick while volunteering for the pest house to care for the soldiers suffering from a smallpox epidemic.

The mission is to address the impacts of nature over the past 150 years by returning the leaning graves to their original state when erected; to address the landscaping inside the small rock border to eliminate water washing out the grounds compromising the foundation of the stones and building a wall around these hallowed grounds to give these heroes the privacy they deserve from the surrounding neighborhood.

Thanks to the ladies of our OCR Chapter sponsoring an event raising money in September 2016 and the blessing of support from unexpected places this project is becoming a reality.

The City of High Point confirmed our plan of a privacy wall is required to be masonry to avoid any concerns in the future.

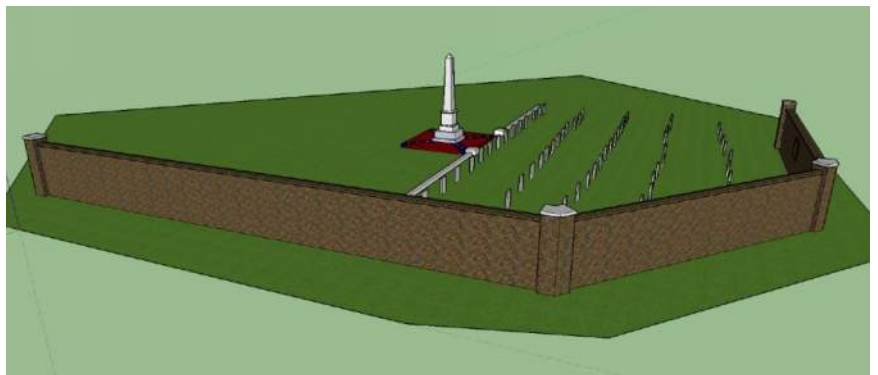
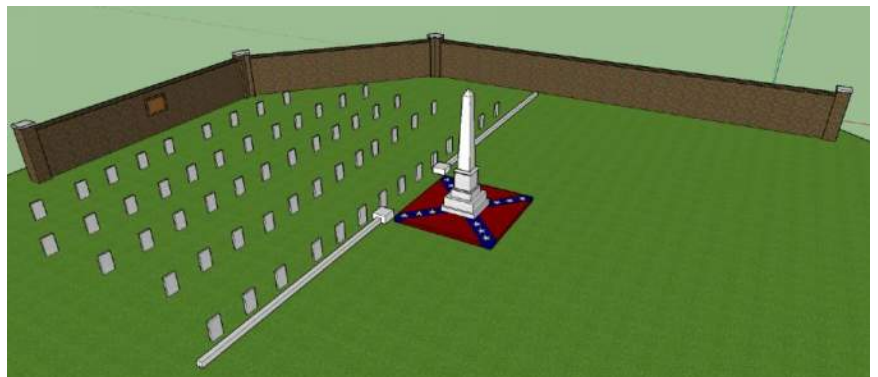
